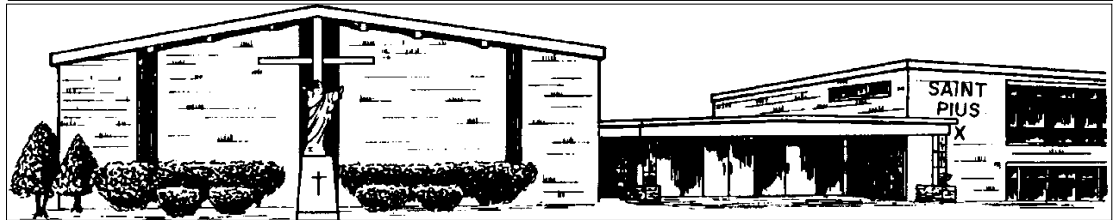

Renew My Church is the Archdiocese of Chicago’s **call for renewal**. Through Renew My Church, the archdiocese is working to strengthen parish vitality and better align its resources and its mission.

All 344 archdiocesan parishes are divided into 97 groupings, which will meet over the next few years. St. Pius X, as you know, is grouped with St. Hugh in Lyons, St. Mary in Riverside and Mater Christ in North Riverside.

On Tuesday, July 30 St. Mary Parish hosted a gathering for the parish councils in our grouping. It was an evening of prayer, sharing, reflection and hope. We discussed: What are we doing well? What are we missing? How can we work together to create abundance where there is a shortage? There was also some discussion on how our group could work together with various programming, such as, Advent, Lent/Easter, and the Summer Bible Day Camp Totus Tuus.


At this time, we will continue to meet and work with our grouping parishes along with working to strengthen the vitality of St. Pius X through our ministries and attendance at Mass. What can you do? Reach out to others, invite them to mass, become a member of one of our many ministries, and pray.

**MEMORIAL OF PIUS X, POPE**  
**Be a warm-hearted believer**



Pope Pius X pastored the universal church from 1903 to 1914, a tumultuous period in world history, which saw traditional ways of life giving way, whether in the natural sciences, politics, or economic life, to new ways of thinking, organizing, believing. Though most commonly remembered as a staunch traditionalist and “anti-modernist,” Pius should also be remembered for his simple, unpretentious lifestyle (he never lost sight of his poor roots), his personal warmth and love of children, and his generous charitable outreach. After the horrific Messina earthquake of 1908, the most destructive earthquake ever recorded in Europe with some 100,000 casualties, Pius is said by one source to have filled the Apostolic Palace with refugees long before the Italian government acted. Make sure a warm heart is front and center in your own life of faith.
